Getting Ready

I am going to the theatre.

I can go with my family, friends, or support staff.

It is okay to feel excited, nervous, or unsure.

I can arrive by car, bus, taxi, or train.

Outside the Theatre

The theatre is a big building with lots of glass.

It is near the river.

I may see other people, signs, and posters about the show.

This is what the building looks like from the outside:



The Foyer

Inside, I will see the foyer.

There are lights, posters, and staff wearing badges.

Sometimes it might be busy or noisy. This is okay.

I can cover my ears, use headphones, or take a break if I need to.



Box Office

I will see a wooden counter with computer screens.

A staff member will be behind the counter.

I can ask them for a ticket or any help I need.



Food and Drink

I might see other counters where I can buy food or drinks.

Staff can help me if I want to buy something.

It might smell like food or coffee.



Toilets

If I need to use the toilet, staff can help me find them.

If I need help later, I can ask again.

This is what the toilets look like:




Tickets

You will need your tickets to get into the performance.

You might have a paper ticket a bit like this.



Or you might have your ticket on your phone like this.



Entering the Auditorium

When it is nearly time for the show, an announcement or staff will tell me the doors are open.

Staff wearing a black top or Riverfront badge will help me.

They may ask for my ticket.



Some doors are downstairs and some upstairs.



To get upstairs I can use the stairs or the lift to Level 2.





The auditorium is where people sit to watch the show.

All seats face the stage.

I will find my seat using the letter and number on my ticket.

If I need help, staff will show me.

I may need to go up or down steps to find my seat.



During the Show

When the show starts, the theatre will get darker and quieter.

I might hear sounds, music, or loud noises.

Lights may flash or move.

These are all part of the show.

If it is too loud, I can cover my ears or take a break.



Quiet Space

If the pantomime gets too loud or busy, I can take a break.

There is a quiet space where I can go.

If I need to use the quiet space, staff can help me find it.

There is a TV in the quiet space. I can watch the pantomime there if I want to.



About the Pantomime

I am going to watch Rapunzel.

This show is a fun, lively story with lots of singing, dancing, and talking.

The actors may talk to the audience and ask me to join in by clapping, shouting, or cheering.

I can join in if I want to, or I can stay quiet. Either is okay.



There will be:

- . Bright, colourful lights
- Funny noises or sound effects
- . People laughing and clapping
- . Music and singing

Some parts might be loud, surprising, or silly.

If it feels too loud or too busy, I can cover my ears, use headphones, or take a break.

It is all part of the show, and everyone is safe.


The story is about Rapunzel and her adventure.

They are only pretending to be bad.

People in the audience might say "Boo!"

This is part of the show and meant to be fun.

I can boo if I want to. I can stay quiet if I want to. Both are okay.

Everyone is safe.

In the pantomime, there is a funny character called Muddles. Muddles likes to make people laugh.

When Muddles comes on stage, he might say Shwmae to the audience, which means Hello. He will ask everyone to say "Shwmae Muddles!"

I can say "Shwmae Muddles!" if I want to.
I can stay quiet if I prefer.
Both are okay.

There is a bear in the pantomime.

The bear is not real.

It is a person wearing a bear costume.

The bear is just pretending.

It is safe to watch the bear.

Interval

The show will have a break called an interval.

It usually lasts 15-20 minutes.

During the interval, I can:

- . Walk around
- . Use the toilet
- . Buy a drink or snack

Or I can also stay in my seat if I want to.

An announcement will tell me when the show starts again.

End of the Show



At the end, people may clap or cheer.

I can clap, wave, or do nothing.

If it is too loud, I can cover my ears or leave.

When it is time to leave people usually leave through the same doors they came in.

Going to the Riverfront Theatre is a new experience.

I can enjoy the show in my own way.

It is okay to ask for help anytime.

The theatre staff want me to feel safe and welcome.
